



**REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF
NEOGA HELD IN
CITY COUNCIL CHAMBERS, MUNICIPAL BUILDING, 533 CHESTNUT
MARCH 21, 2011, AT 7:00 P.M.**

CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Mayor Modglin, and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Those present were: Commissioners Lindley, Varner, Groves, Mayor Modglin, and City Clerk Evans. Commissioner Kepp arrived at 7:25 p.m. Others present were City Treasurer Diana Foor, Terry & Shelia Holsapple, Tom Overmyer.

MINUTES

After reviewing the regular session minutes from March 7, 2011, Commissioner Groves made a motion to approve the minutes as presented. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Lindley. Ayes, Commissioners Groves, Lindley, Varner and Mayor Modglin. Nays, none. Motion carried. 4-0.

PUBLIC AFFAIRS

SHELIA HOLSAPPLE, VENDING MACHINES

Sheila Holsapple approached the Council about leasing the North West corner of 6th & Rt. #45. Ms Holsapple would like to place a portable building on the property with vending machines. Holsapple said that her husband and her have vending machines in Greenup and Toledo as well, and predict that they will be grossing about \$50,000 per year. It was the consensus of the Council to consider their request and make a decision at the next meeting.

FINANCE

BILLS

After reviewing the proposed bills, Commissioner Kepp made a motion to pay the bills totaling \$80,420.17. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Varner. Ayes, Commissioner Kepp, Varner, Groves, Lindley, and Mayor Modglin. Nays, none. Motion carried. 5-0

TREASURER REPORT

After reviewing the treasurer report, Mayor Modglin ordered the financial report to be placed into the files of the City Clerk.

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PUBLIC PROPERTY

NEOGA MEMORIAL CEMETERY

City Clerk Evans presented an intergovernmental agreement that was delivered to her by Neoga Township Road Commissioner Lloyd Lacy and Neoga Township Clerk Doris McKay. The Council reviewed the proposed agreement, and the consensus of the Council was to take it under consideration.

IKE RECOVERY GRANT – TOM OVERMYER

Tom Overmyer from Phoenix Consulting Engineers, LTD., delivered a copy of the submitted IKE Recovery Grant. Overmyer explained to the Council the reason why only one side of Neoga was submitted. The applications are currently being reviewed by an outside consulting company. Overmyer believes that the grants should be awarded in late April or early May.

Tom Overmyer proceeded to explain the different services that his firm offers. He expressed an interest in working with the City of Neoga again.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

The Council discussed the concerns about the overtime in the past few weeks and after a lengthy discussion, Commissioner Varner made a motion to reduce the overtime hours to 5 on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday.

STREETS AND ALLEYS

Commissioner Groves explained to the Council that he met with Cumberland County Highway Department Engineer Ben Bland about doing some road work in conjunction with the City of Neoga; however, Bland explained that the bid letting would be held the following week so it was too late for this year.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

Commissioner Lindley told the Council that the City has been receiving numerous calls about people's yards and the need to get these places cleaned up once the weather allows.
