PUBLIC AFFAIRS, MAYOR HARTKE

WAIVING LATE FEES ON WATER & SEWER BILLS

Mayor Hartke explained to the Council that due to the executive orders by Governor Pritzker, he would like to waive all late fees for water and sewer bills through May. The Council will revisit it again at the last meeting in May. After very little discussion, Commissioner Groves made a motion to waive all late fees on water and sewer bills for April and May 2020, and revisit it at the last meeting in May. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Helm. Ayes, Commissioner Groves, Helm, Hakman, and Mayor Hartke. Nays, none. Motion carried. 4-0.

WATER DISCONNECTS

Mayor Hartke told the Council he feels the same with late fees; he would like to waive any water disconnects during this time. With little discussion, Commissioner Groves made a motion to eliminate water disconnects for April and May 2020 and revisit it at the second meeting in May. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Hakman. Ayes, Commissioner Groves, Hakman, Helm, and Mayor Hartke. Nays, none. Motion carried. 4-0.

POLICE CAMERAS

Police Chief Schabbing told the Council that he has applied for a camera grant, but would like to have permission to purchase the camera IF they were awarded the grant. Schabbing said one in car camera will cost \$4,955.25. After little discussion, Commissioner Hakman made a motion to purchase one in car camera for \$4,955.25 if the

PURCHASE OF MOWER

Superintendent Durbin told the Council that he has received multiple quotes for a new 60" zero turn mower. Durbin said that he has given the Council the lease options as well as the quotes for purchasing a new mower. Superintendent Durbin said that he would like to purchase the Gravely from Mowers & More because it supports a local business, and any work that needed done would be here in Neoga. After a lengthy discussion, Commissioner Helm made a motion to purchase the Pro-Turn 260 Commercial Duty 60" Gravely from Mowers and More in the amount of \$9,700. Due to a lack of a second the motion died.

Mayor Hartke told the Council that with the current situation, he felt it would be a good idea to not increase the water and sewer rates at this time.
